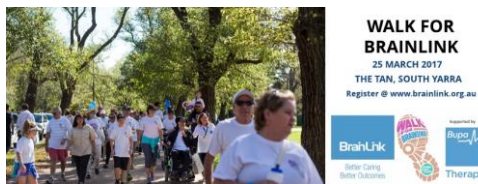

LifeMoves is an 8 week structured peer support program that enables people living with an acquired brain disorder to openly discuss the issues and challenges they face as a consequence of their acquired brain injury and share strategies they have used to deal with them.

The volunteer facilitators of the program are living with an acquired brain disorder, so they bring current lived experience to the group, as well as their training as facilitators.

The program aims to provide participants with a confidential and supported environment in which they can explore the significant challenges they face with others in a similar situation as themselves.

As a result, we hope that participants will gain more confidence and be part a new social network of peers for ongoing mutual support. There is no charge for the program.
